Message from the Head of Corps

Welcome to 2017 and the 75th Anniversary of the founding of our Corps. The Corps was founded to deal with the challenge of the ever increasing technical complexity of military materiel and the maintenance requirements that came from that. While it has been 75 years since the founding, everything has changed, but remained the same.

New equipment and capability such as Land 121, Land 400 and Land 19-7B promise an evolution in the way we deploy and fight. The Army has reorganised its combat Brigades under Plan Beersheba to make best use of this new equipment. The Army's maintenance and logistic systems have been reorganised under the CSS CONOPS using the results from Plans Pelican and Centaur to be more effective.

Whilst the equipment is new, the organisational change is not; 1942 saw the amalgamation of maintenance effort into AEME from the Ordnance Corps and various unit workshops to cope with the sudden influx of technologically advanced equipment required for the war. Civilians and contracting are not a new idea either. The first DGEME, Brig Martins, the founding Head of Corps, noted that in May 1945 there were 139,000 civilians and 345,000 soldiers employed in EME services across the Commonwealth. This mix of a civilian and military workforce has been with us from the beginning.

I am extremely proud of the Corps and how we have adapted, and are adapting, to new technology. RAEME will continue to provide invaluable service now and into the future, as we have in the past.

Employment Category Management & Training

The release of CA Directive 08/16 - Implementation of CSS Force Structure Capability and Sustainability Establishment Review, has brought with it some slight changes within the trade structure for ECN 229. The Production Clerk role has been re-established within Workshops as an ECN 229. This means that the role is no longer RAAOC ECN 298, and is solely a RAEME responsibility.

The Employment Specifications for ECN 229 have already been updated to reflect this, and will be added to all RAEME trades following the Employment Specification review in Q1 2017. This will give greater flexibility to commanders and to DSCM-A to post the most suitable member to that position.

CA Directive 08/16 also directed that ECN 229 posted to 10FSB acquire the basic skill set for weapon systems on the LCM8. This has been in the employment specifications since 2014, with no further remediation required.

Training will continue to be refined particularly as new capabilities roll out. Expect that further streamlining will occur in the Subject 4 CPL (Rec Mech) course, some armoured courses as well as the suite of maritime courses.
