The Artificer badge qualification was authorised for reintroduction by the Australian Army in 1989; the badge is believed to have been removed as an embellishment after WWII.

2017 sees five new Artificers graduated their capstone course after nine months of rigorous and challenging training, both within RAMS and the Royal Melbourne Institute of Technology (RMIT). The RMIT phase is a 5 month course of intense delivery, including subjects such as materials, aerodynamics, maths, physics, engineering and administration all leading to a Diploma in Aviation Maintenance Management; the RAMS component having a more operational focus involves scenario based training and

assessment within the regulatory framework.

These new graduates make up an alumnus of 121 Army artificers since the first 'partnership' course conducted by RMIT in 2005.

Changes to the Artificer training continuum in 2018 will see the Operations Phase (Part B) moved to the beginning of the calendar year and the RMIT component to the latter half of the year. The adjustment to the course program provides

an opportunity to report on the strengths of each Artificer prior to posting and promotion and enhance the delivery of pre-course maths and physics.

At the recent graduation from RMIT CO RAMS thanked RMIT management and staff on their continual level of support and professional dedication to the delivery of this course—a sentiment which was shared by all students.

The Head of Corps Cell

One of the functions of the Head of Corps Cell is to recognise the service that each and every RAEME soldier has given their country. The Head of Corps issues a signed “Certificate of Service” for discharging RAEME soldiers. The certificate is signed by the Head of Corps, framed, and acknowledges their service to the Corps and the Army. However, the HOC Cell is not informed of a soldier’s discharge; therefore Unit personnel need to contact the HOC Cell to arrange a signed and framed certificate. Please ensure that you allow up to six weeks between informing us and receiving the certificate.

Over the next six weeks, the HOC Cell will be issuing a Commemorative Lapel Pin to celebrate the 75th Anniversary of the founding of the Corps. All badges will be distributed through the Regional RAEME Reps. There are two types: a Commemorative keepsake consisting of gold badge with coloured enamel and a Corps themed backing card. One badge will be freely available to each RAEME soldier in the Corps, ARA and ARes. The second badge is a wearable badge with an antique metal finish. This badge and additional Commemorative badges can be purchased through the Head of Corps Cell.

Corps Fund Membership

Thank you also to all those that have joined the RAEME Corps Fund in the past two months. We have had well over 25 soldiers sign up for Life Membership. Your support of our Corps is most valued.

Technical Regulatory Framework Update

The next update of the TRAMM-L (Issue 5.6) will be released in Dec 17. It is a major rewrite with significant changes to regulations. Over the last year, DTR-A has undertaken a review of the policy in the TRAMM-L, taking into account changes to Army organisation and responsibilities, other Defence policy and the WHS legislation. As an example, fitness for service is now managed by AHQ's Land Capability Division. The biggest change from the review is the definition of technical integrity, which will now focus solely on land materiel safety. Units must still ensure fitness for service and environmental compliance under other regulations. The new definition of technical integrity has led to reduction in the number of regulations in the TRAMM-L from 330 to 33.

Units will need to review, and possibly update, their Technical Integrity Management Directives (TIMD). To assist reviews and update of TIMD, awareness presentations will be delivered before the end of the year. The land materiel maintenance SOP will be updated and include maintenance processes and procedures previously published in TRAMM-L. SO1 Land Maintenance System

A New Badge and Flag for the Army School of Electrical and Mechanical Engineering

Army and Air Force personnel at the Army School of Electrical and Mechanical Engineering assembled on the 11th of August to conduct a Unit Insignia, Flag and Unit Shoulder Patch change ceremony. The changes from the RAEME insignia to the current unit symbology have been brought about to display the bi-service nature of school training RAEME, RAE and RAAF technicians. The reference to the Army Apprentices School insignia; which was also used for the Army College of Tafe, reflects on the school's history and is symbolic of the values that are required of all military technicians, values of which still remain unchanged to date.

At the apex of the badge is the Crown of the Sovereign, expressing allegiance to the Sovereign, Superiors, Duty and Country. Superimposed on a cogwheel which represents trade and



technical training, is the English Cross of St. George, depicting the virtues and development of character. The St.

George's Cross is then overlaid with crossed, doubled-edged swords, representing military qualities of courage, discipline and physical fitness. Superimposed upon the swords and the Cross is a flaming torch of learning.

The RAEME Training Centre was the Corps school of RAEME, where all members of the Corps gathered throughout their career to develop their technical mastery essential to maintain Army's maintenance effect. Today ASEME conducts initial training for ground technicians; as well as Army aviation technicians as they progress through their careers. The future for ASEME may even

include elements of the junior officer training to establish ASEME as the Corps school preparing RAEME personnel across all ranks and trades to provide Army's maintenance capability.



The retirement of the old unit flag also coincided with the departure of Corps RSM, WO1 Robert Turnbull, from ASEME onto a deployment to the Middle East Region.


